The first year we had 2 teams from the VA hospital and 14 teams total. I am happy to say over the last 6 years we have raised over \$8000.00, that we have shared between the VA hospital and the Folds of honor. Also, at last year's event we had a flyover by 3 WWII fighter planes which really took the outing to the next level, so I hope in years to come we can get 20-25 teams involved. At our newest course Stoatin Brae this fall, we hosted the first ever event to raise money to help improve course conditions at Custer Greens, the golf course on site at the hospital

I have volunteered in giving lessons to the veterans at the PGA Senior championship the last couple of times they have hosted the tournament.

Final thoughts:

Probably the biggest thing that I have gotten out of this experience so far and the thing I am most proud of, is a former patient at the VA hospital who was in our Project Hope program is now an employee at one of our courses on the grounds crew, so I get to see first hand how getting involved can change a person's life. Come spring I hope to add 2 or 3 more.
