Please describe your involvement and contributions through mentoring PGA of America Professionals and Associates and illustrate the significant impact on their careers.

Doug Bell came to Cadillac Country Club as a caddie when he was in eighth grade. By the time he was a Junior in High School he became the leader of the Bag Room and was capable of covering the Pro Shop when needed. As a Senior in High School he asked about pursuing a career in golf through the PGM Program at FSU. Cadillac is about 40 miles from FSU, in Big Rapids. Doug graduated from FSU and had great internship experiences. After graduation, Doug came back to Cadillac Country Club as my Assistant Professional. During that time, Doug recruited his 12 year old Nephew, Ian Ziska, to do odd jobs around the Pro Shop. Ian climbed the ladder at the ProShop just like Doug did, ten years later. Ian also decided he wanted to pursue a career in golf and graduated from FSU with a PGM Business Degree.

Both Doug Bell, PGA and Ian Ziska, PGA have both had wonderful careers in golf. Both became Chapter Presidents and Section Board Members. Today, Doug is the General Manager of American Dunes Golf Club, Grand Haven, Michigan, and Ian the Head Golf Professional. Doug has been honored by the Michigan PGA with a number of Special Awards, most recently Golf Professional of the Year, in 2023. He has also been honored with 3 Patriot Awards and a Merchandiser of the Year Award. Ian Ziska has been honored by the Michigan Section with 8 Merchandiser of the Year Awards to 2 locations, a Bill Strausbaugh Award, and a Patriot Award. In 2023, Ian was honored by the PGA of America with the Merchandiser of the Year - Public Award. I refer to Doug and Ian as the kid Brothers I never had.

Please describe the characteristics you possess relative to your overall integrity and recognition as a person of outstanding character and furthered the values representative of the PGA.

I was a young Professional, who was responsible for paying my golf staff, I was very hands on. I would open the Shop and pull carts and then become the starter. My Assistant would usually watch the Shop and my Bag Person would watch the Bag Room. We would all work closely together. Each person was vital to our success, but ultimately I was responsible for all. All had responsibilities and were accountable. My job was to make sure each knew what their responsibilities were and to constantly remind them, in a positive way. I learned that constant reminder is how good habits are created. Constant encouragement helps to build confidence. I expected that all of us would be judged accordingly to the worst things did. That means our worst attribute needs to be very good. Our goal would be to do our best every day to figure out how to make our best contribution to the Team. Being a good example every day and expecting others to do their best every day builds confidence in those who follow your example.

At Kendall Academy, I encouraged our Coaches to do their best, in their own way, to make their students better, to learn from both their fellow Coaches and their student's experiences, help their students to be the best problem solver possible. Being an outstanding problem solver breeds confidence for both the student and the Coach.

As a Golf Course Owner, my job is to remove the obstacles to success for our management. We must depend on and empower our leaders to lead, provide guidance and encouragement when appropriate.

I have had hundreds of relationships with developing players and young employees. The feedback I have received most often is that they learned a great deal about golf in our time together, but were surprised that they learned at least as much about life and its lessons.
