## Analyze Fleet Policies, Procedures, and Financial Performance

**Description:** Look at the current golf car fleet and analyze policies and procedures.

Time Needed from PGA Professional: 15-20 minutes

- Number of members, annual rounds played, cart fee per round, annual golf fee(if applicable)
- Cart brand and model, fleet size, age, gas/electric, owned or leased.
- Estimated percent of golfers that take a cart.
- Estimated total golf cart revenues & estimated total golf cart expenses.
- Take a picture of daily and weekly checklists (if N/A create your own checklists).
- May have questions about policies and procedures depending on what access they have.

# **Comprehensive Career Plan**

**Description:** In Pt. 1 the Associate will interview a Supervising Professional at their place of employment to learn about their career path. Pt. 2 is focused on refining a personal development summary and goal plan. Pt. 3 the Associate will adjust their resume and cover letter based on the Supervising Professionals feedback.

### Time Needed from PGA Professional: 45 minutes

- Supervising Professional's career path
  - progression
- Supervising Professional's opinion of key.
  knowledge, skills, and experiences needed to succeed.
- Two (2) challenges the Supervising Professional faces on a day-to-day basis.
- Feedback on their current resume and cover letter.

# Plan, Prepare, & Run a Tournament Event

**Description:** Shadow or run a tournament event from start to finish while collecting the needed documentation. <u>A small to medium size event is best</u> <u>for this assignment.</u>

**Time Needed from PGA Professional:** 30 Minutes and periodically throughout the event.

## PART 1:

- Annual total golf rounds, total green fee revenue, annual number of tournaments, annual tournament rounds.
- Planning details for the event- name, purpose, sponsors, field size, type of players, entry fee, F&B budget, format
- Tournament Organization Summary including staff assignments, date required, and date complete for each task.

#### **PART 2:** Information Needed to Complete Activity:

- Assistance collecting **photos** of the following:
  - Bag drop/Valet
  - Registration table
  - Golf cart fleet preparation/staging
  - Range Setup
  - Event Setup
  - Event Signage(sponsorship, special contests, directional signage, etc.)
  - Additional Event Details

### Information Needed to Complete Activity:

• Software used to create pairings and tee

assignments

- Assistance collecting **<u>photos</u>** of the following:
  - Tournament Information Sheet
  - Rules Sheet
  - Hole Location Sheet
  - Scorecards
  - Scoreboard (physical or digital)
- Procedures for managing the pace of play and

contingency plans

# Review & Evaluate the Tournament

**Description:** Review staff, event setup, feedback, future event improvements, revenue, and expenses following the tournament.

Time Needed from PGA Professional: 30-45 minutes

- After Action Review: results, pace of play, weather, and additional notes.
- Staff recognition and concerns.
- What went well and what action should be taken to improve the event in the future?
- Revenue from entry fees, golf cart fees, sponsorships, merchandise sales, F&B sales.
- Expenses from merchandise cost, F&B cost, prizes, staffing, advertising, event supplies, etc.
- Total net income from the tournament.

# **Assess Your Own Equipment**

**Description:** Measure all ten static club performance specification numbers and dynamic measurements in order to find gaps and make recommendations for appropriate golf club adjustments.

Time Needed from PGA Professional: 20-30 minutes

- Measurements needed for all 14 clubs:
  - Grip size in decimals
  - Length in inches
  - Shaft Flex
  - Shaft weight in grams
  - Alphanumeric swing weight
  - Total weight in grams/ounces
  - Loft & Lie angle in degrees
  - Face angle as a static measurement
  - Ball speed in mph
  - Launch Angle in degrees
  - Spin rate in rpms
  - P.T.R/Smash
  - Carry distance
- Assistance recognizing gaps between club data.

# **Observe Two Lessons Part 1**

**Description:** Observe two different PGA Professionals as they each conduct a full swing Lesson for 60 minutes.

Time Needed from PGA Professional: 60-90 minutes

Information Needed to Complete Activity:

# Observe a Player Engagement Program at a Facility

**Description:** Observe a player engagement program at a golf facility, answer questions about the program, and record an observation video.
